With reference to our letter dated 2 June 2025 (attached below), please note that the EIA Scoping Process for the above-mentioned Project has been completed. The Final EIA Scoping Report, including all relevant Appendices, has been submitted (in hard copy format) to the MIME as the Competent Authority, and to the MEFT, Department of Environmental Affairs for review on the 3rd of June 2025.

Green Metals Refining Namibia (Pty) Ltd has also engaged on numerous occasions with the Walvis Bay Municipality as part of their land acquisition agreements. Furthermore, as another key stakeholder and landowner of Farm 58, ASEC has also liaised with the Walvis Bay Municipality during the EIA Scoping Process.

As required by the EIA Regulations, the submitted Scoping Report outlines, among other aspects, the methodology and approach to be followed during the Impact Assessment phase of the EIA process. The MEFT, in consultation with the duly designated Competent Authority, will either approve the Scoping Report or request that additional tasks be undertaken during the Impact Assessment Phase.

It is therefore important to note that the Scoping Report does not constitute the final report for decision-making regarding the Environmental Clearance application. However, as indicated in our letter of 2 June 2025, the Impact Assessment Phase of the EIA process — including the relevant specialist studies and the preparation of the EIA Report and Environmental Management Plan (EMP) — is currently underway and will be completed following MEFT's review and decision on the Scoping Report.

Therefore, taking the above into consideration, the EIA Report and EMP still need to be developed. Once completed, these documents will be submitted to, among others, the MIME and the Walvis Bay Municipality for their review, input, and comments / consent.

Accordingly, a "Letter of Consent from the Relevant Authority" could not yet be provided as part of the Scoping Report submission.
