PUBLIC CONSULTATION MEETING MINUTES:

ENVIRONMENTAL SCOPING ASSESSMENT (ESA) FOR THE PROPOSED PROSPECTING & EXPLORATION ACTIVITIES ON EXCLUSIVE PROSPECTING LICENCE (EPL) No. 9413 LOCATED ABOUT 20KM SOUTH WEST OF OKANGUATI, KUNENE REGION.

Date: Monday, 26 May 2025

Time: 16:00 – 17:30

Venue: Etanga community center, Kunene region.

The public consultation meeting was attended by Forty-eight (48) persons, including two (2) Environmental Consultants and one (1) Archaeologist/Heritage specialist from Excel Dynamic Solutions (Pty) Ltd (EDS) - **Please refer to the attached attendance register.**

1. INTRODUCTION AND WELCOMING REMARKS

The meeting was opened by the environmental consultant with an introduction of the team, who they are, and why they are consulting affected parties of the proposed prospecting and exploration activities on EPL 9413. The meeting attendance register was then circulated for the attendees to write down their names and contact details so that they could be added to the list of interested and affected parties (I&APs) and receive further information on the ESA process.

2. MEETING AGENDA AND PRESENTATION

The agenda of the meeting included the following main points:

2.1 Brief Description of the Project

The Environmental Scoping Assessment (ESA) and the reason that the Proponent appointed Excel Dynamic Solutions (Pty) Ltd (EDS), an independent Environmental Consultant to carry out the ESA and apply for the Environmental Clearance Certificate (ECC).

2.2 Explanation of what an ESA is, its Process, and the Public Role in the Process

Mr. Nerson Tjelos explained to the attendees the purpose of the meeting and why they were invited (with reference to the Environmental Management Act (EMA) No. 7 of 2007 and its 2012 Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations on Public Consultation). Mr. Tjelos further explained what an ESA is and that the proposed exploration activities are one of the listed activities in the 2012 EIA Regulations of the EMA that cannot be undertaken without an ECC from the Environmental Commissioner.

2.3 Presentation of Potential Project Impacts

To ensure transparency and that the attendees understand both sides of the proposed project activities, the Environmental Consultants also presented the potential pre-identified potential positive & negative environmental and social impacts.

2.4 Public Open Discussion (Interactive Session)

Mr. Tjelos allowed the meeting attendees to raise their concerns, issues and/or comments on the proposed project activities. The concerns/issues and comments recorded are presented in **Table 1** below.

Once the review of the draft ESA Report and EMP is done, the documents will be finalized and submitted to the Environmental Commissioner at the Department of Environmental Affairs and Forestry (DEAF) for evaluation and consideration of an ECC.

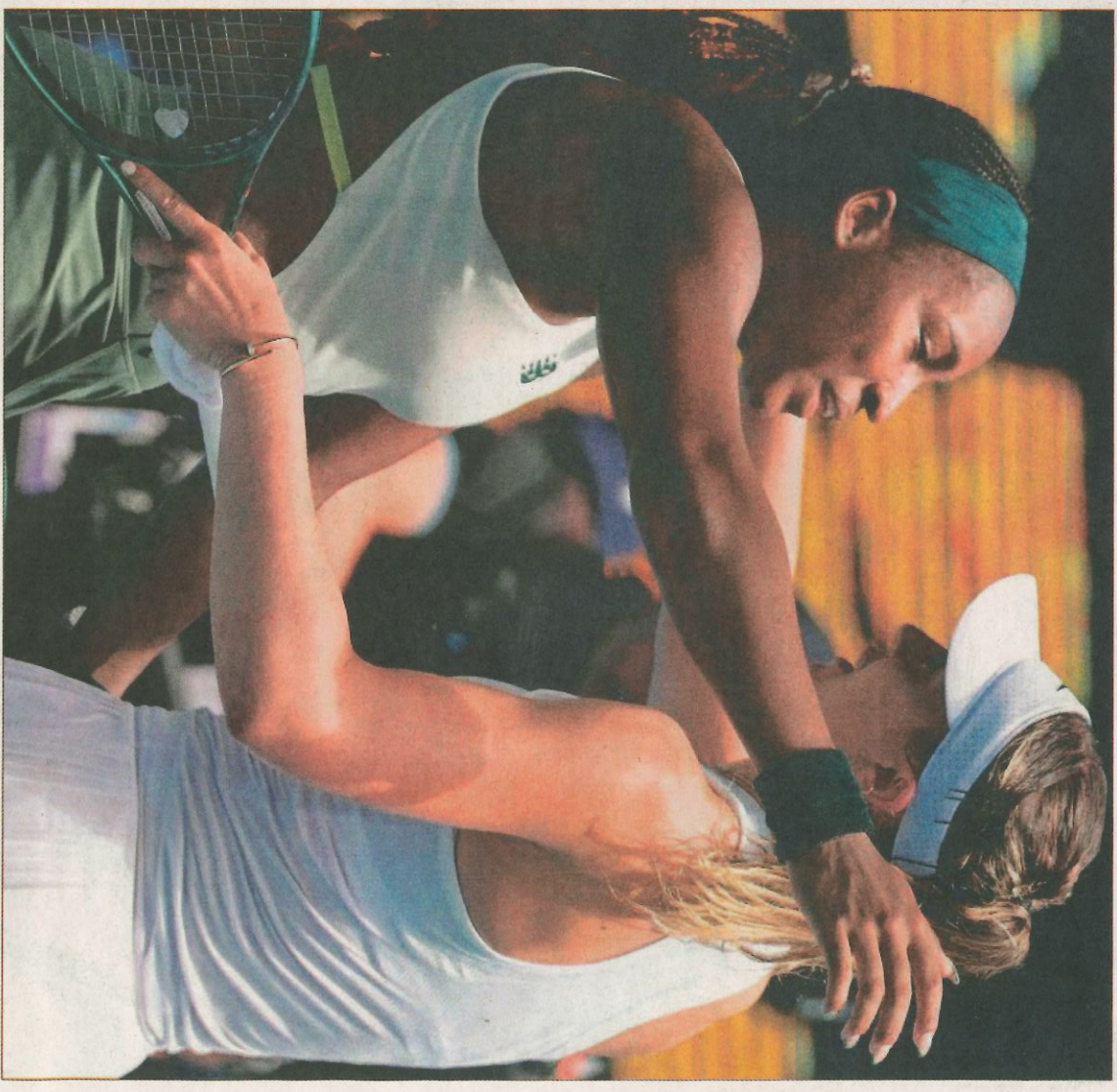

"Today, I came in and I wanted to play my best game, and I think I did it," she said. "Coco, at the beginning, she was playing insane tennis, but I'm super-proud of the level I gave today."

Paula Badosa eliminates third seed Coco Gauff

MELBOURNE - Coco Gauff's winning run came to an end against Paula Badosa in the quarter-finals of the Australian Open.

The American third seed arrived here as the most in-form player on tour after winning the WTA Finals to end last season, and then all five singles matches at the United Cup, including one against Iga Swiatek.

She went into the last-eight tie with 11th seed Badosa on a 13-match winning streak, but it was the Spaniard who came out on top in a 7-5, 6-4 victory. Badosa feared she may have to retire last year because of a persistent back problem, but ended the season strongly, making the quarter-finals of the US Open, and has now hit a new high in Melbourne.

"Today, I came in and I wanted to play my best game, and I think I did it," she said. "Coco, at the beginning, she was playing insane tennis, but I'm super-proud of the level I gave today.

"A year ago, I was here with my back, and I didn't know if I had to retire from this sport, and now, I'm here playing against the best in the world. I won today, I'm in the semi-finals. I will never think that a year after I would be here."

Both players held serve until 5-5 in the first set, when Badosa struck before opening up a 5-2 lead in the second set.

She was unable to serve it out at the first time of asking, but made no mistake the second time around to set up a clash against either top seed Aryna Sabalenka or Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova.

Gauff was left to rue 41 unforced errors, but was philosophical afterwards, saying: "Paula was playing great. Maybe some moments in the first

set could have gone my way, could have been a different outcome in the first set.

"I think it's just a lot more work to do. I'm obviously disappointed, but I'm not completely crushed. I'm looking forward to a lot. Even though I lost today, I feel like I'm in an upward trajectory."

Gauff said after her defeat, she was departing the Grand Slam with clear ideas on what to improve in a welcome contrast to how she felt after her US Open title defence ended last year.

World No 3 Gauff was far from her aggressive best, but said she felt more positive than she did after her fourth-round loss to compatriot Emma Navarro at New York.

I feel like (at the) US Open I was playing with no solutions, so I think that was more the frustrating part. Today, I feel I'm playing with solutions. "I know what I need to work on."

Gauff parted company with coach Brad Gilbert after the US Open, and hired Matt Daly and began making a few adjustments to her game, including grip changes.

Things did not go according to plan for Gauff against Badosa, with the 20-year-old identifying her serve as something that needed a bit more work after six double faults.

"I needed to work on my serve," Gauff said. "I'm not saying that my serve is where I want it to be, but I worked on it. Obviously, a big improvement. I want to continue working on that, continue working on playing aggressive.

"I feel I was ready from the start of this tournament," she added. "Yeah, with each match I found solutions. Then today, I was close to doing that as well. I'm obviously disappointed, but I'm not completely crushed."

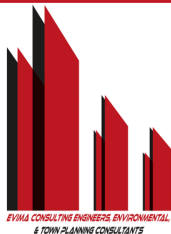

Coetzee, Greef deliver strong performances

DRIKUS Coetzee and Anri Greef took top honours last Sunday, as they delivered solid performances to claim victory in the elite men's and women's Nedbank Windhoek Power Pedal (WPP) Race Series 3 at Döbra Loops in Windhoek.

In the men's competition, Coetzee claimed first place after clocking 02:19:55, with Roger Suren following in second with a time of 02:21:35, and Marco Thiel in third in a time of 02:21:35.

In the women's competition, Greef crossed the line in 01:52:50, followed by second-placed Michelle Doman in a time of 01:56:17, a split second ahead of Rosemarie Thiel at 01:56:17 in third place.

The result means Team MBM Men and Holland Elite are joint log leaders with 63 points, followed by Cymot Men's Racing Team in third with 60 points.

Meanwhile, in the women's competition, Holland Ladies led the log with 40 points, followed by the Food Lover's Market Ladies Team with 31 points in second place, and the third-placed Cymot Ladies Racing Team with 26 points.

A relieved Coetzee was delighted with his race on the day, saying he was happy with his performance, having suffered a tyre puncture during the WPP 2 race at the Copper Kettle.

"The guys started easy, and on the

second lap, the attacks began with a few guys breaking out. I took it easy at the back, but my teammates made sure I was in the race every time an attack happened. When the moment came in the third lap, I took over the lead," he said.

Coetzee would be leaving for Morocco for the Atlas Mountain (mountain bike) Race, which is over 1 300 kilometres (km), with 29 000 metres (m) of climbing.

"This race is my main challenge of the year, and if I can pull that off, then my goal for the year would have been met. Later in September, I will go to Spain for Badlands Ultra Endurance - for another 850 km," he said.

Also speaking after the race, Greef said it was a good race for her and her teammates, who worked well together to help her achieve victory.

"Team tactics worked well to keep the other teams at bay and allow me to ride to victory. I managed to get a break on the second lap, and the team helped me to keep it. It was quite a strong field, so my team worked well together, and kept the other teams at bay," she said.

Greef added that her focus now turns to the national championship at the end of February. She is also looking forward to a few races in South Africa, and the Union Cycliste Internationale-sanctioned races during the year.

The next Nedbank WPP race will be in April at the Matchless Mine track.
