### **Minutes of Meeting**

# 1. Introduction and Welcoming

Mr. Chris Ailonga from Matrix Consulting Services (MCS) opened the meeting and welcomed all the individual stakeholders. The purpose of the meeting was highlighted and participants were encouraged to comment on the proposed development in order to improve the project relevance to stakeholders' needs and expectations. Participants were asked to complete the attendance register.

Mr. Chris Ailonga from MCS gave an overview of the proposed development. He emphasised the need for proactive participation during the meeting as it was the right platform to provide information, recommendation and to receive feedback from the project developers and consultants.

#### 5. Summary of Comments

Most of the concerns were about job opportunities for locals, fear of an increase in water rates, animal and community water to remain, communication between the contractor and tradition authorities in the area, and the emphasis was placed on fair remuneration for unskilled labour.

The King Nehale Conservancy Management recommended that the conservancy must be an important stakeholder for the project, and that no illegal wood harvesting or hunting must take place during the construction phase of the project.

The project should give opportunities to the youth in the area, especially unskilled labour. The community also urged that their cattle herders not be employed on the project. The school must be prioritized to get water first. The community complained that this project is long overdue, and must become a reality very soon. The traditional leaders urged community members with fences or illegal structures to move them further from the pipeline servitude, to ensure safety of community members.

Most of the identified impacts could be mitigated through good environmental management practice.

#### 6. Meeting Closure

Mr. Chris Ailonga thanked the participants for attending the meeting, and for being conversant during the meeting.
