Frost Strikes Okongo Farms

Farmers in Okongo, Ohangwena Region, suffered significant losses last week due to heavy frost that affected their crops, such as tomatoes, green peppers, chillies, pawpaws, and bananas.

Toivo Nghidengwa, a farmer in the Okongo constituency, shared on Eagle FM that half a hectare of his farm had been damaged by frost, leaving him uncertain of the regrowth of his lost crops.

"The leaves of my vegetables are completely dried out. This happened overnight, and it's disheartening for a beginner like me, as I have only just started farming," he expressed.

Regarding the planting period, Nghidengwa explained that he planted tomatoes four months ago, and they had appeared to be maturing well before the frost struck. He noted that he had hoped for a successful harvest this year, but with frost now in the picture, he anticipates a loss.

"In previous years, frost damaged only some leaves, leaving the plants largely unaffected. But this year's frost is much worse, as it has impacted the entire plant. I will have to uproot all the crops because they are already dead," he said.

Nghidengwa urged the government and other stakeholders to assist farmers with essential techniques for predicting weather patterns, enabling them to better protect their crops from frost.

"We need support in the form of protective netting for our crops and appropriate spraying methods that can shield them from frost. The government should help those of us whose crops have been affected, as we invested significant resources with the hope of a successful harvest after four months, which is no longer feasible," he expressed.

Among the crops luckily not damaged, he listed spinach, carrots, onions, and cabbage. When asked why he didn't consider planting winter crops, Nghidengwa explained that they were encouraged to produce food throughout the year,

stating that they cannot afford to pause during the winter season or plant only winter crops, as there would be no food available for their customers.

"Focusing solely on winter crops is not a solution. We need support and strategies to prevent frost damage so that we can continue planting a variety of crops," he added. Another Okongo farmer with fruit trees, Kaunda Namholo, reported that the cold temperatures during winter notably damage their crops due to frost.

"Over 100 pawpaw trees and approximately 30 banana trees have been affected by frost. What is frustrating is that my pawpaw trees were bearing fruit, and I will wait a month to see if they recover," he noted.

He added that while frost typically arrives in July, this year it came unusually early in June, catching them unprepared to cover and protect their crops, as successfully done in the previous year. "Yes, I understand there are other methods, like increased watering, but we have tried those, and they don't help. Covering the trees with blankets is effective, although it can be costly," he explained.

Namholo concluded by advocating for the establishment of greenhouses to facilitate efficient continuous production, noting that continued reliance on food imports puts Namibia at a disadvantage.

"We need our leaders to witness firsthand how frost impacts farmers, and to explore ways to help them. Without support from the government, farmers may ultimately abandon their efforts," he added.

This month, the Namibian Agronomic Board (NAB) announced that only six crops are temporarily closed for importation without restrictions, due to many vegetable farmers having been affected by frost.

In a notice Dr. Fidelis Mwazi issued on June 20, he stated that the crops facing border closures include all types and sizes of butternut squash, cabbage, onions, pumpkins, sweet potatoes, and spinach.

Additionally, Namibia will allow the importation of seven vegetable crops without restrictions from a total of 20 controlled crops, while another seven crops will be eligible for importation on a pro-rata basis.
