"We're not asking for handouts. We want fair access to local markets," said Albert Mutesi, another farmer.

"If hostels, schools, and hospitals buy our produce, we can grow more, employ more people, and feed the nation," added Mutesi.

Mutesi also called for input subsidies, improved market access, and better infrastructure to support farming activities. He lamented the rising costs of production, saying he expects to spend N\$468,000 this planting season on seeds, fertilisers, and chemicals alone.

"We're not making any profit at all. There's literally nothing coming in. It's very stressful and unsustainable, considering electricity costs and rising input prices have reduced our yields," Mutesi explained.

"We used to harvest 160 to 170 tonnes from 20 hectares, now it's significantly less," he concluded.

Sikondo Farm Manager Maxwell Nghidinwa also criticised the fragmented approach by State-Owned Enterprises (SOEs) in procurement.

"SOEs are operating in silos. They are ignoring green schemes that are producing vegetables," he said.

"Two years ago, the Ministry of Education engaged us to align hostel procurement with our produce, but nothing has materialised," he further stated, stressing that the government must lead by example.

"Government must buy from its own initiatives first. Only then can we talk about broader markets," Nghidinwa highlighted.

Marketing remains a key challenge. Farmers say even after a successful harvest, they often struggle to find buyers. Namibia currently imports about 70% of its food and fertilisers - mainly from South Africa - with high transportation costs inflating prices.

In response, Agriculture Minister Zaamwani-Kamwi acknowledged the farmers' concerns and reaffirmed the government's commitment to supporting local producers.

Prime Minister Ngurare underscored the need for a collaborative approach between farmers, traditional authorities, and policymakers to strengthen agricultural development in the region.

This renewed call adds momentum to national conversations around food security, rural development, and economic empowerment through local procurement.

find themselves stuck in low-productivity, low-paying service jobs, with limited access to formal employment or opportunities for upward mobility.

The findings paint a stark picture of a country rich in resources but struggling to translate that wealth into shared prosperity and sustainable employment.

Between 2012 and 2018, the report shows, Namibia experienced a major labour shift. Employment in agriculture—a traditional backbone of the rural economy—fell significantly, while jobs in the service sector expanded.

However, this shift has not been accompanied by economic transformation. Most of the new service jobs are informal, precarious, and marked by low wages and poor working conditions.

These are the jobs into which many young people are being funnelled, often after completing secondary or even tertiary education, with little hope of escaping the cycle of economic vulnerability.

The IMF argues that the heart of the problem lies in the mismatch between economic growth and inclusive development.

While Namibia's GDP is expected to grow steadily over the coming years—thanks in part to growing investment in oil, gas, and green hydrogen—this growth is not generating enough quality jobs. In fact, real GDP per capita has remained stagnant, and unemployment remains one of the highest in the region.

Youth unemployment alone exceeds 47%, and the situation is particularly acute in rural and peri-urban areas, where economic opportunities are scarce and job networks are weak.

The report also highlights Namibia's growing dependence on resource extraction as a potential long-term risk. Without strong policy frameworks, the IMF warns, the expanding oil and gas sector could worsen the divide between the formal and informal economies.

Resource wealth may drive up national revenues and attract foreign investment, but it will not automatically improve people's lives unless accompanied by deliberate efforts to strengthen the labour market and ensure that Namibians—not just multinational firms—benefit from the boom.

As part of its recommendations, the IMF calls for robust investment in vocational education and skills development, particularly in sectors able to absorb large numbers of workers.

It urges the government to foster stronger linkages between high-growth industries and the domestic labour force through apprenticeships, procurement requirements, and local content strategies.

The report also points to the need for improved data collection, noting that Namibia lacks reliable labour force data, especially in the informal sector, where most young people work.

Equally important, the IMF stresses the need to expand access to credit, technology, and business support services for small and medium enterprises (SMEs), which remain key drivers of job creation.

In addition, the study recommends strengthening Namibia's social protection systems to shield vulnerable workers—particularly young people, women, and rural residents—from labour market shocks.

The IMF's report arrives at a pivotal moment in Namibia's development journey. With vast natural resources and new global interest in its energy potential, the country stands at a crossroads.

Whether it chooses to grow inclusively, or repeat the mistakes of other resource-rich nations that left their people behind, depends on how it responds to these labour market warnings.

The challenge now is not just to grow the economy, but to ensure that every Namibian has a fair chance of participating in it.
