Savannah Environmental Consultant Services CC (the consultant) has been appointed by Tsika Energy (Pty) Ltd (the proponent) to act on their behalf in obtaining an Environmental Clearance Certificate (ECC) for proposed construction and operation of a 20-megawatt (MW) solar photovoltaic (PV) power plant at Shankara Village , of the Ndonga Linene constituency , Kavango East region, see **attached Background Information Document (BID) as an Appendices**, and the proposed development will occupy an area of approximately 50 hectares.

The proposed project forms part of Namibia's broader commitment to increasing the contribution of renewable energy to the national electricity mix, enhancing energy security, and reducing reliance on imported electricity and fossil fuel-based generation. Namibia has one of the highest solar irradiation levels globally, with average daily solar radiation ranging between 5.5 and 6.5 kWh/m² across most regions, making solar photovoltaic technology a technically and economically viable option for utility-scale power generation.
