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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Public participation for the proposed DR3469 Mbeyo–Erago access road in Ncamangoro Constituency, Kavango West Region, was conducted from 27–29 January 2026. Meetings were held in Mbeyo, Sihetekera, and Erago villages, engaging traditional leaders, community members, youth, and directly affected households. This project represents a historic milestone, being the first road development in the constituency since independence.

The consultations provided communities with an opportunity to raise expectations, concerns, and aspirations. Key issues included:

- **Employment & Recruitment:** Requests for household-based employment quotas, prioritization of local residents, fair and transparent recruitment processes, and opportunities for youth.
- **Business & Livelihoods:** Calls for designated trading areas, mobile vending opportunities, and facilities to support small-scale enterprises along the road corridor.
- **Infrastructure & Development Needs:** Requests for electricity supply, water points (particularly between Erago and Mbeyo), and a communal garden to offset agricultural land loss.
- **Directly Affected Households:** Concerns about compensation and relocation for households impacted by the road alignment.
- **Timeline & Communication:** Communities asked for clarity on when recruitment would begin and how opportunities would be communicated.
- **Road Alignment Concerns:** The Erago community highlighted discrepancies between the design presented locally and the version submitted to the Governor’s office. They emphasized that the current alignment could increase accident risks and cause unnecessary loss of land parcels, while a straight-line alternative would avoid these challenges.

Despite these concerns, communities expressed gratitude for the development, recognizing the road project as transformative for local progress and improved livelihoods.

The project team has committed to prioritizing local recruitment, supporting livelihood opportunities, documenting requests for complementary infrastructure, and reviewing the proposed alignment to minimize safety risks and land impacts. Continuous engagement and transparent communication will remain central to ensuring that community voices are integrated into project planning and implementation.

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1. INTRODUCTION

The Government of Namibia, through the Ministry of Works and Transport, Roads Authority and Trinitas Engineering Consultants, is undertaking the construction of a new road DR3469 in Ncamangoro Constituency, Kavango West Region. This project represents a significant milestone, as it is the first road development since independence in the constituency, and is expected to improve accessibility, stimulate local economic activity, and enhance social services for surrounding communities.

As part of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) process, public participation was conducted to ensure that the voices of affected and interested parties are heard and integrated into project planning. Public participation is a critical component of the EIA, as it promotes transparency, inclusivity, and accountability in decision-making. It provides communities with an opportunity to express their concerns, expectations, and aspirations, while enabling project planners and engineers to identify potential social and environmental impacts early in the process.

The consultations were held in three clustered villages namely Mbeyo, Sihetekera, and Erago, which represent the communities most directly affected by the proposed road alignment. Meetings were attended by community members, traditional leaders, youth, and households located along the proposed road corridor and in the surrounding areas. The discussions focused on issues of the impact of the proposed road, employment, recruitment processes, livelihood opportunities, infrastructure needs, and the treatment of directly affected households.

This report documents the outcomes of the public participation process, summarizing the concerns raised by communities, proposed responses and mitigation measures, and recommendations for integrating community input into the EIA and project design. It is intended for submission to the Ministry of Works and Transport, circulation among project engineers, and feedback to the participating communities.

2. METHODOLOGY

2.1 Approach to Public Participation

Public participation was conducted in line with the requirements of Namibia's Environmental Management Act and EIA guidelines. The objective was to ensure that all affected and interested parties had an opportunity to be informed of the proposed construction of the access road and be allowed to contribute to the assessment process, raise concerns, and provide input on the proposed road construction project.

The consultations were designed to be inclusive, participatory, and accessible, with emphasis on engaging directly affected households, traditional leaders, youth, and community members from the clustered villages and the surrounding areas.

2.2 Consultation Process

Dates & Duration: Public participation meetings were held during the week of the 27th – 29th January 2026

Venues: Meetings took place in three clustered villages namely Mbeyo, Sihetekera, and Erago, within Ncamangoro Constituency.

Participants: Attendance included the constituency leaders, traditional authorities, community members, youth, women, and households located along the proposed road corridor and surrounding areas.

Format: Meetings were conducted in open community settings, allowing for dialogue, questions, and collective discussion. Facilitators explained the project objectives, potential impacts, and opportunities, followed by community members raising concerns and expectations.

Language & Accessibility: Local languages were used to ensure inclusivity, and facilitators provided clarification where needed to avoid misunderstandings (e.g., avoiding the “yes/no” recruitment system).

2.3 Data Collection

Concerns and Inputs: Issues raised by communities were recorded in detail during each meeting.

Documentation: Attendance registers, meeting minutes, and photographic records were compiled to support transparency.

Categorization: Concerns were later grouped into thematic areas; employment, recruitment, business opportunities, infrastructure needs, directly affected households, and timelines of the project, for analysis and reporting.

2.4 Limitations

While the consultations were comprehensive, some limitations were noted:

- Not all villages in the wider cluster could attend due to logistical constraints.
- Some participants expressed difficulty with formal recruitment processes, highlighting the need for simplified and participatory methods.
- Some were concerned about the design of the road that might result in accidents especially for the ambulance vehicle.

3. STAKEHOLDER CONCERNS & INPUTS

3.1 Overview

During the public participation meetings in Mbeyo, Sihetekera, and Erago villages, community members, traditional leaders, youth, and directly affected households raised a range of concerns and expectations. These inputs reflect both immediate needs related to the road construction project and broader aspirations for local development.

The concerns have been grouped into thematic areas for clarity: employment and recruitment, business and livelihoods, infrastructure and development, directly affected households, and timelines/processes.

3.2 Key Concerns Raised

Employment & Recruitment

- a) Request that contractors employ one person per household.
- b) Recruitment should prioritize local residents before considering outsiders.
- c) Avoid the confusing “yes/no” recruitment system; communities asked for clearer, participatory methods.
- d) Youth emphasized their need for employment opportunities to support education and livelihoods.
- e) Concerns about inclusivity: whether people without national documents, certain age groups, or only experienced workers would be considered.

Business & Livelihood Opportunities

- a) Communities requested opportunities to sell traditional foods and goods during construction.
- b) Need for designated spaces or market facilities to operate businesses along the road corridor.
- c) Desire to follow contractors to different sites to continue business activities.
- d) Request for a place to establish small-scale enterprises.

Infrastructure & Development Needs

- a) Requests for electricity supply in villages.
- b) Need for water points, particularly between Erago and Mbeyo.
- c) Proposal for a large communal garden to compensate for agricultural land loss.
- d) General appreciation for development and desire for complementary services.

Directly Affected Households

- Concern about households impacted by the road alignment and requests for clarity on compensation or relocation measures.

Timeline & Process

- Communities asked when employment opportunities will begin.
- Request for clarity on how recruitment will be communicated and implemented.

Road Alignment Concerns

Community members in Erago raised concerns about discrepancies between the road design presented locally and the version submitted to the Governor’s office. They emphasized that the current alignment could increase accident risks and lead to unnecessary loss of land parcels. The community proposed a straight-line alignment, which they believe would avoid safety hazards and minimize land impacts.

4. RESPONSES & MITIGATION MEASURES

4.1 Employment & Recruitment

The project team acknowledges the strong emphasis placed on local employment. To address these concerns:

- a) **Household Employment:** While employing one person per household may not be feasible in all cases, contractors will prioritize recruitment from directly affected villages and ensure fair distribution of opportunities.
- b) **Local Priority:** Recruitment will prioritize local residents before considering applicants from outside the constituency.
- c) **Inclusive Criteria:** Clear communication will be provided regarding age, documentation, and experience requirements. Where possible, entry-level positions will be created for youth and unskilled workers.
- d) **Recruitment Process:** The “yes/no” system will be avoided. Instead, participatory methods such as assisted interviews, written forms, and community liaison officers will be used to ensure inclusivity and clarity.

4.2 Business & Livelihood Opportunities

Communities expressed strong interest in benefiting from business opportunities during construction. To address this:

- a) **Trading Spaces:** Designated areas will be identified along the road corridor for local vendors to sell traditional foods and goods.
- b) **Market Facilities:** Temporary stalls or trading zones will be considered to support small-scale enterprises.
- c) **Mobile Vending:** Contractors will allow mobile vending opportunities near construction sites, provided safety standards are maintained.
- d) **Business Support:** Engagement with local authorities will explore ways to formalize and sustain these business opportunities beyond construction.

4.3 Infrastructure & Development Needs

While some requests extend beyond the scope of the road project, they are important for long-term development:

- a) **Electricity:** Requests for electrification will be documented and forwarded to the relevant authorities for consideration.

- b) **Water Supply:** The need for water points, especially between Erago and Mbeyo, will be communicated to relevant authorities. Opportunities for borehole installation or water infrastructure will be explored.
- c) **Community Garden:** The proposal for a communal garden to compensate for agricultural land loss will be assessed in collaboration with local leadership and agricultural extension services.

4.4 Directly Affected Households

Households impacted by the road alignment will be assessed individually.

- a) **Compensation:** Compensation will be provided in line with Namibian EIA regulations and resettlement guidelines.
- b) **Relocation Support:** Where relocation is unavoidable, households will be supported to ensure minimal disruption to livelihoods.
- c) **Consultation:** Directly affected households will continue to be engaged throughout the project to ensure their concerns are addressed.

4.5 Timeline & Communication

- a) **Recruitment Schedule:** Contractors will provide clear timelines for employment opportunities and communicate them through traditional leaders and community meetings.
- b) **Ongoing Engagement:** Continuous dialogue will be maintained with communities to provide updates on project progress, recruitment, and mitigation measures.
- c) **Feedback Mechanisms:** A grievance redress mechanism will be established to allow communities to raise concerns during construction.

4.6 Road Alignment Review

The project team acknowledges the concerns raised regarding the proposed alignment. A technical review will be undertaken to assess accident risks and potential land parcel loss associated with the current design. Consideration will be given to the straight-line alternative suggested by the community, with the objective of minimizing safety hazards and avoiding unnecessary displacement.

5. CONCLUSION & NEXT STEPS

The public participation process in Mbeyo, Sihetekera, and Erago villages provided valuable insights into community priorities and concerns regarding the DR3469 road construction project. Communities emphasized the importance of local employment, transparent recruitment, livelihood opportunities, and complementary infrastructure development. They also raised critical concerns about households directly affected by the road alignment and requested clarity on compensation and relocation.

In addition, the Erago community highlighted discrepancies between the alignment presented locally and the version submitted to the Governor's office. They cautioned that the current alignment could increase accident risks and lead to unnecessary loss of land parcels, while a straight-line alternative would avoid these challenges.

By integrating these inputs into the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) and project design, the road construction initiative can deliver inclusive development benefits, strengthen community trust, and ensure compliance with regulatory and social safeguards.

Recommended Next Steps

- a) **Employment & Recruitment:** Develop and communicate a transparent recruitment framework prioritizing local households and youth; replace the "yes/no" system with accessible, participatory methods; share recruitment timelines through traditional leaders.
- b) **Business & Livelihoods:** Identify designated trading areas along the road corridor; facilitate opportunities for local vendors; explore provision of temporary stalls or market spaces.
- c) **Infrastructure & Development:** Document requests for electricity and water supply and forward them to relevant ministries; assess feasibility of installing water points between Erago and Mbeyo; explore community garden initiatives.
- d) **Directly Affected Households:** Conduct household-level assessments; provide compensation or relocation support in line with Namibian EIA regulations; maintain ongoing consultation.
- e) **Road Alignment Review:** Undertake a technical review of the proposed alignment to evaluate accident risks and land parcel impacts; compare the current design with the

straight-line alternative suggested by the community; ensure final alignment decisions are communicated transparently to both the Governor's office and affected communities.

- f) **Communication & Engagement:** Establish a grievance redress mechanism; maintain continuous dialogue with local leadership; ensure communities are informed of how their concerns are being addressed.

In conclusion, the participation process has demonstrated strong community interest in the project and highlighted the need for inclusive planning. By responding to these concerns, including the alignment review and maintaining transparent communication, the project can achieve its dual objectives of infrastructure development and community empowerment.



Location: Mbeyo-Erago Clusters (Mbeyo, Sihetekera and Erago)

1. Community Feedback

- Appreciation expressed for the road project; community noted they have waited for this development for a long time.
- Concerns raised about mahangu fields and potential loss of land. Questions asked regarding compensation and how it will be determined.
- Employment and recruitment queries:
 - How recruitment will be conducted.
 - Requirements for employment.
 - Location of recruitment activities.
 - Clarification on whether jobs will be for skilled or unskilled workers.
 - Whether or not people without national documents will be considered.

Business opportunities:

- Proposals for local enterprises.
- Who to contact for supply opportunities?
- Location of business bases (e.g., catering services).

Requests for:

- A map of the road and identification of affected households.
- Clarification on how the road alignment will affect houses and villages.
- Assurance that all villages under the cluster will be considered for employment.

Concerns about road design:

- Current geometric design differs from initial proposal.
- Preference for a straight road with branches to villages, instead of curves.
- Fears that zig-zag design may increase accident risks and delay emergency services (ambulance access).

2. Leadership Remarks

Chief's Address:

- Confirmed that compensation will follow government and traditional authority policies, based on household impact.
- Emphasized the need for community members to prepare for required skills.
- Encouraged equality, inclusivity, and equity in employment, with specific encouragement for women to participate.
- Requested community cooperation, including not removing survey pegs.

Headwoman Mrs. Hileni:

- Encouraged the community to support the road construction project.

3. Key Concerns & Requests

- Compensation process and clarity on affected households.
- Transparent recruitment process with equal opportunity.
- Road design adjustments to minimize risks and better serve villages.
- Assurance of community involvement in business opportunities.
- Not to use the *yes/no* recruitment process as some may not understand and lose out on opportunities
